By signing this permit, applicants agree to abide by the BOCA National Fire Prevention Code, Chapter 7, Part 3 of the Township of Richland Code of Ordinances and the following regulations:

- ◆ No recreational fire site may exceed dimensions measuring three feet in width, three feet in length and three feet in height.
- ◆ No bonfire site may exceed dimensions measuring five feet in width, five feet in length and five feet in height.
- ◆ Only the burning of clean fire wood/logs is permitted.
- ◆ Burning of building material, plastics, chemicals, gasoline and oils is strictly prohibited.
- ◆ All open fires must be attended at all times and properly extinguished at the conclusion of the activity.
- ◆ The obligation to indemnify, hold harmless and defend shall include, but not be limited to, the obligation to pay judgments, injuries, liabilities, damages, attorney's fees, reasonable expert fees, court costs and all other costs of indemnification.
- ◆ This permit shall be valid only for the calendar year in which it was issued.
- ◆ The Permit Holder agrees to monitor weather and environmental conditions and agrees to not conduct burning when weather and environmental conditions prevent same.
