The Richland Township website has a Stormwater Management/Flood Control page where residents can get information on the Township's MS4 responsibilities and all 6 MCMs, download the Township's Stormwater Management Ordinance, Floodplain Ordinance, or watch a "Be Stormwater Smart PA" video. Also, there is information on illicit discharge reporting, DEP's swimming pool discharge guidelines, construction site complaint forms, A Homeowner's Watershed Protection Guide, and a Homeowner's BMP Maintenance Guide. The Township also holds two MS4 public meetings each year, and the agendas and minutes from those meetings are posted to the website as well, as well as copies of all annual/status reports.

In September of 2018, the Township mailed out Stormwater BMP Maintenance reminder information to residents who have installed a stormwater BMP as required by the Township's Stormwater Management Ordinance/building permit application process. The information included a description of their BMP, maintenance issues that may need addressed, and how to properly maintain their BMP.

A maintenance flyer was developed and will be included in the packet of information and distributed to residents who are required to install a small project SWM BMP.

Richland Township updated their 2008 Stormwater Management Ordinance on November 19, 2018, in order to meet the standards of Allegheny County's Act 167 Stormwater Management Plan. A draft of the 2018 ordinance update was advertised to the public via public meetings, newspaper advertisements, and online via the Township website. Opportunities for public comment and feedback were made available at the public meetings, or could be submitted by mail or email to the Township. Public comments were reviewed and addressed prior to ordinance adoption.

Richland Township celebrated their annual Community Day event in August of 2018. The Township's Community Day is a free outdoor event in the Township park where various community organizations and groups attend for outdoor fun, food, games, etc. Township staff created an educational stormwater display, "What's My Watershed?" for the 2018 Community Day event, in which visitors had to figure out and "pin" what watershed their property was located in on a watershed map.

In April of 2019, Richland Township sponsored and participated in a "Woods for Waters" event. This event was created by the Allegheny County Conservation District with the purpose of gathering people together to plant trees in the Pine Creek watershed. Being in the Pine Creek watershed, Richland sponsored the event and advertised it to their residents via SavvyCitizen (mobile notification system), on the Township website, and in the Township's spring newsletter. The event was a great success, and the Township plans to either hold a cleanup event or similar event in the spring of 2020.


